

The COVID pandemic has been particularly hard on the community of Callejas, where many residents relied upon finding occasional daylabour within the fishing industry, processing shrimp or sugar cane, or picking melons.

The goal of this year's ONE DAY CHALLENGE is to provide much needed repairs to the elementary school, as well as to the homes of families in the most extreme poverty. Projects will be carried out in partnership with Harvest Honduras and the local church in Callejas.

Every penny you give will go directly to helping those who need it most, in ways that instill renewed hope and bring about lasting improvement. By giving the equivalent of one day of income, you can help to bring a lifetime of change to these families in Callejas.





Callejas is an impoverished neighbourhood in the fishing village of Cedeño, on the Pacific coast of southern Honduras. This community has 2,000 residents living in 380 homes – an average of six people per household.

Many homes are in dire need of latrines, pilas (water storage tanks), concrete floors and roof repairs. In addition, many homes have plastic tarps as walls, and our goal is to provide

wood planks to give these homes greater protection and structural strength.

Callejas has a three-room school serving 250 students up to Grade 6. However, the classrooms need repairs including removal of asbestos, and the school requires a new roof, fencing and latrines.

Being situated on flat land not far from the ocean, Callejas is vulnerable to flooding and storm damage during rainy season, as well as mosquitoborne diseases such as Dengue fever and Zika virus.

Families live mainly from fishing for consumption and for sale. Some work as employees of fishing companies, and some have their own boat and sell their catch to 'coyotes' (re-sellers). A few residents work in the sugar cane fields or at the shrimp and melon farm. However, many of these jobs have



been suspended due to the pandemic. A few families receive remittances from relatives who are working in the United States or elsewhere within Honduras.

One Day Challenge projects will be carried out through Harvest Honduras in partnership with the local church in Callejas, focusing on the elderly, single mothers, and impoverished families with special needs children.

A 'pila' will give this family a concrete basin in which to store water.
